#### AWARDS

CHARTER MEMBERSHIP AWARD-Issued free to Charter Members by the MOBILE AMATEUR AWARDS CLUB INC, with a billfold size membership card. Charter members may use the letters MARAC C followed by their issued number on their QSL cards. This will count three points for anyone working for the Associate membership award. If you are both Charter member and obtain the Associate award, use Charter number only on QSL cards.

REGULAR MEMBERS-Are issued billfold size membership cards. They may use the letters MARAC R followed by their issued number on their QSL cards. This will count for two points for any amateur working for the Associate membership Award. If you are a regular member and have the Associate Award, use the Regular membership number only on QSL cards.

ASSOCIATE AWARD-Issued to any radio amateur for working (SWL on heard basis) Charter, Regular or Associate members for a total of 100 points. Red seal and ribbons for 250 points. Blue seal and ribbons for 500 points. Gold seal and ribbons for 1000 points. You must use the letters MARAC A followed by issued number on your QSL cards if you use MARAC on your cards. This will count one point to any amateur or SwL working for the Associate Award. Fee \$1.00, seals and ribbons for sase.

M-50-M AWARD-Issued to any amateur (STL on heard basis) for working mobiles in all 50 States, from fixed, mobile, portable or combination of such. Basic award for 48 Stateside States, red seal and ribbons for 49th State. Blue seal and ribbons for 50th State. Gold seal and ribbons for working all States mobile to mobile. Fee \$1.00, seals and ribbons for sase.

YL MOBILE AWARD-Issued to any amateur (SWL on heard basis) for working 5 different YL'S or XYL'S or combination of such while they are operating mobile in a total of 50 different counties. They may be worked from mobile, fixed, portable or combination of such. Red seal with ribbons for 100 counties, blue seal with ribbons for 200 counties, gold seal with ribbons and trophy for 1000 counties. Basic fee \$1.00. Seals and ribbons sase. Trophy compliments MARAC.

MARAC DX MODILL AWARD-Issued for working 25 DX stations while you are operating mobile. Red seal and ribbons for 50 DX contacts. Blue seal and ribbons for 75 contacts. Gold seal, ribbons and MARAC trophy for 100 DX contacts. Basic fee \$1.00. Seals and ribbons sase. Trophy compliments MARAC.

GCR rules applies for all awards. No fee for handicapped. ASSOCIATE, M-50-M and YL MCDILE AWARD now being issued. MARAC DX MODILE AWARD being designed by artist and will be ready for issue soon. The annual MARAC MCDILE operator Award (one time basis) and the MARAC Net Control Award (repeat basis) will be given each year. Each will be selected by MARAC membership ballot.
