MINUTES REGULAR FEBRUARY MEETING

Due to the February meeting being held in California with President WAØWOB attending, the minutes of the February meeting will be carried in the March news-letter.

MINUTES EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

The Executive Committee met at the QTH of KØAYO on Jan. 26, 1974. The meeting was called to order by President WAØWOB at 2015. The Treasurer reported a balance on hand of \$463.56 in the general fund, \$194.98 in the Convention fund and \$22.00 in the Special Fund as of 1/25/74. The President discussed Convention details and the need for additional help The President has talked to WBØGYR regarding his participation. His responsibilities would include such things as registration tables being manned, meeting rooms being ready, dining room set up and handling any difficulties with room arrangements and reservations. He will arrange for a map of the local area also. A mailing list has been completed and address-o-graph plates are being made. This totals about 800 names. Due to total cost of mailings, only two will be made. The Vice President will undertake editing a questionaire to include in the mailing. The Treasurer (KØPFV) will handle all registrations and prepare the registration form to include in the mailings. \$150.00 has been set aside for entertainment. The Awards Chairman (WØSJE) will arrange. Responsibilities have been assigned to various members to arrange for door prizes (Transceivers, antenna, etc). The Executive Committee agreed to present a proposed change to the By-laws to the Board of Directors. This change has to do with staggering the date that dues of new members become due. A draft will be sent to the Board of Directors for consideration. Meeting adjourned at 2230. Members present were WAØWOB, WAØYJL, KØAYO, KØPFV and WØSJE.

My second suggestion is: All fixed stations check into the net with their name and county. K4FPF/Ø - After listening to a prime example of what should or should not be considered a valid contact this morning on the 20 meter net I thought I would get up on my soap box. The fixed station made nine attempts at receiving his signal report and after going thru seven different combinations ranging from 5/8 to 2/2 finally received the report. It would seem reasonable to define a valid contact as one in which some intelligence was passed between both stations. For county hunting purposes this is done by giving signal reports. In instances such as the example I have given it seems rather than passing information which established contact, about the only relation established between the two stations was little more than both happened to have their rigs turned on and their VFO's tuned to the same frequency at the same time. The reception of his signal report became a process of elimination for the fixed station. A rule presently exists which prohibits the relay of any part of the signal reports exchanged. I would like to suggest the next ICHN Convention consider a more restrictive definition of what constitutes a valid exchange of signal reports to confirm a QSO. My own opinion is that only two different attempts, such as beginning and end of a mobile run or between splatter, and three signal report combinations maximum should be permitted. Signals do go up & down & get covered with QRM & a second attempt at the end of the run would take this into consideration. These condx exist when working DX, for the 5BWAS or just ragchew type QSO's & stations still make contact another day when propagation is better or interference is reduced. Our mobile net operation greatly increases the ease with which counties can be worked. Establishing a better defined procedure for exchanging signal reports would eliminate the "guessing game contacts" & maintain the quality of the USA-CA. 73 de PAUL.

W7PXA - Now down to 19 & hope to get them during 74. The Wx here2 1/2 weeks after Xmas was miserable. It was as low as 12 below a couple of times & temps remained near or below 0 the rest of the time. Then we had a complete change. Temps came up & we had lots of rain. - 6.) A special certificate will be awarded Vermont multi-operator stations.
