### MINUTES OF THE MARAC MONTHLY MEETING

The September MARAC meeting was held on September 6, 1986 at the Holiday Inn, East, St. Paul, Minn. The meeting was called to order by WBØTVL at 9:00 A.M. Present were: WBØTVL, NØAKC, WBØKIN, W9LHG, WAØLKL, WØNNH, WØOWY and WBØUPU.

The minutes of the August meeting were read. Motion by WØNNH, second by WBØKIN, approved.

Treasurer's report submitted by W9LHG. Motion to accept by NØAKC, second by WBØUPU, approved.

W9LHG reported that he had discussions with several area banks relative to the handling of the MARAC checking account. He stated that he was negotiating with one of them for a "no service charge" account. He and WBØTVL will, following approval of the Board, sign all necessary documents. The MARAC savings account will stay in the present depository pending further evaluation.

WBØUPU reported that in accordance with the motion carried at the August meeting, a copy of the revised Constitution and By-Laws was mailed to every paid up member along with a ballot to be returned by the member by October 1, 1986. He will have a tally of the vote available for the October MARAC meeting.

WBØTVL reported that the AWARDS Committee will prepare a ballot describing the pros and cons of a MARAC sponsored All Counties Award for inclusion in the Roadrunner. This procedure is in keeping with the motion passed by the membership at Asheville in July, 1986.

WBØTVL also reported that the Radio Society of Great Britain requested a society of our Awards information for inclusion in their publication.

The next MARAC meetings will be on October 4 and November 1, 1986 at 9:00 AM at the Holiday Inn.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:15 AM.

We hope that this will provide you with some new ones, and it will give us a chance to put some out that we have not done before.

A membership vote at the July, 1986 General MARAC Meeting held in Asheville, NC. required that a ballot be mailed to all active members if CQ Magazine did not modify their "Team Contact" ruling.

CQ has replied to the petition forwarded after the Asheville meeting and has said that their "Team Contact" ruling will not be changed.

As a result of the Asheville vote, and the reply received from CQ Magazine, members are now asked to decide whether or not MARAC should sponsor an "All Counties Award"

The Awards Committee meeting at Asheville recommended that MARAC does not sponsor an "All Counties" award.

In reaching this decision the committee, made up of N5QQ. W3XE, K4QFK, WA4CHI with WB0TVL as Chairman, considered some of the many problems which would need solutions.

Cost...It was estimated that for first class art work and printing the bill would run between \$400 and \$1,100. W7LQT and W0OWY each made an offer of \$100 to help cover the expense, but it is obvious that we could never come close to recovering the outlay.

Demand for the award... The USA-CA Award was, and is, the most sought after award of it's kind, we could never hope to replace it with one of our own.

Publicity... The USA-CA Custodian has said that we could publish details of any MARAC Award in the CQ Magazine Awards Column, but outside of the limited MARAC membership it is unlikely that we would attract much interest.

Numbering the Award...It would be necessary to allow previous contacts to be counted for qualification, but who gets the first number. Somebody has suggested that we give USA-CA holders their USA-CA number should they apply, but what number do we give the person who does not have a USA-CA number?

There are also problems of administration... How would people apply for the award? would it be issued in stages?

These and other problems would be considered by the Awards Committee should the membership decide to go with a MARAC Award.

Ballots should be returned before October 31 and the results will appear in the December"Roadrunner"

Editor Roadrunner,

Please publish in the next newsletter.

I am not against DX stations even though many of them have not treated me fairly since I started putting out counties over three years ago. I am not an avid DXer. I guess the main reason for this is that I understand from others it is very difficult if not impossible to obtain QSL cards from many of the countries worked. An article in the latest QST has prompted me to make my following comments.

Next year is the 50th anniversary of DXing and ARRL is going to issue a special award for stations working 100 countries during the year. Unlike the regular DX award, OSL cards will not be required just log data. The contest start the first of January 1987 and runs the entire year.

So I plan to make the following changes to the way I operate in 1987. Up until now I have been most tolerant in signing DSL cards for DX stations. I have never refused to verify a contact even after the station has not acknowledged more than once with his personal QSL card. But this will change for me at least during 1987. If I receive a mobile reply card without an indication of the country the DX station is in, or if I do not receive his personal QSL card, then I will be returning these cards unsigned to the bureau. I urge other mobile stations to do the same during next year.

As I said before I am not against DX stations and realize that county hunting is more of a challenge and an expense for them than it is for us. However, they should realize that we mobiles have awards we would like to obtain that require their cooperation. It seems to me that it is not too much for us to ask that during 1987 all DX stations put their country on the mobile reply card. Since a lot of DX stations probably do not get the Roadrunner, I think that net controls from now until the end of the year should periodically mention on the net that some stations like myself will not sign these cards during 1987 unless they cooperate in this matter.

Enclosed is a copy of my response to Stuart Casper, W2PDM, who mailed me the petition on behalf of MARAC. I trust you have a copy of the petition and can follow my comments.

The issue of team contacts is not as simple as my approval or not but the letter of the law. What came to me while I was writing my reply was that the petitioners really didn't understand the issue which basically is the difference between an operators license and a station license. Although we as amateurs tend to look at amateur radio more as a hobby than a service, it really is a service regulated by our government. Most amateurs talk about Part 97 without ever having seen or read any of its contents.

It boils down to a legitimate contact takes place between two licensed stations (two different cll letters) being operated by two licensed amateurs. The licensed amateur uses the call letters assigned to that particular station. The operators license only conveys the class of license held by the operator. If we were all issed two pieces of paper when we passed our exams it would be simple for everyone to understand.

I know that this is not an exciting answer nor one that lets people do what they want, but reality is still reality.

It was mentioned in the last edition of the Road Runner that comments would be solicited for the next edition on the controversy.

I haven"t had an opportunity to make a case to the readership. I just want to recite the facts and let the readership decide for themselves.

I initially made application for USACA 500 &1000 and was approved with no problems.

Over Christmas 1985, I made application for USACA 1500 with a total of 1526 contacts.

Jan 15, 1986 USACA Custodian requests MRCs for four counties. I complied.

Jan 27, 1986 Custodian returns MRCs and fee denying application. I called RCY for clarification, she informs me that she did not like the format of the MRCs. I inform her that the wrong set was forwarded in haste. (my mistake)

She also states that LQT and WBZ were in general very difficult for her. She agrees to look at my other cards and review my previous submittal.

Cards were sent on Feb 4, and a rejection received Feb. 13. Comment in letter was "If you should file an application in the future, it will be considered on its own merit."

In April 86, a new application was sent for USACA 1500 & 2000 with the previous 4 contacts omitted, as suggested by USACA custodian. Aprill 11 brought a new letter from RCY requesting 6 verifications. Cards sent promptly. Cards were sent with single signatures by individuals, W7LQT, and K7AYC.

May 9, 1986 brought a new rejection from RCY stating "you have effectively removed yourself from the USACA program".

In May, WBOTVL graciously calls me to inquire about my situation. I tell TVL I will comply with any rule that Custodian makes so long as there is an end to the hurdles I have to jump. He volunteers to call RCY and find out the situation. He calls me to tell me that I should remove all contacts with W7LQT, WB7WBZ, NOEYK, K7AYC.

I resubmit after reviewing for verification with TVL, a new application with RCY. At this time I have 712 contacts more than is needed for USACA 1500.

I have removed several contacts (60). I further state that "If you find any contact you may construe to be a team contact please feel free to strike it from my application".

In mid-August I recieve from the Custodian an envelope with my application fee, with out any note of explanation.

The above recitation is strictly from the file of letters and correspondence. The reader can draw any conclusions he or she wishes.

My conclusions are that for me County-hunting is not a hobby anymore losing much of its luster. The USACA custodian is free to make her own rules as she sees fit with out any accountability. (You can not win a battle with folks who buy ink by the barrel). That my friendship with LQT and

acquaintance with Roger and Kathleen, are a deciding factor in my difficulties. That no amount of reasonability on my part including throwing out all of my contacts and starting over with the 800 contacts with KB7QO will satisfy the Custodian. That unless MARAC or SOME INDIVIDUAL, offers some form of certificate for first time recognition, this situation could happen to any of you at any time.

I have always conceded any challenge made by the Custodian. I am only an amatuer operator and like many of you I hear on the net I make mistakes. There is no provision in the rules to take some someone out of the program, on a whim for making a mistake. I will readily share my correspondence with anyone with a SASE. I will offer my card library with anyone who wishes to review it.

My heartfelt appreciation to WBOTVL, W7LQT, WA3TUC, K7AYC NOEYK, WB7WBZ all of the MARAC folks, and the many of you who have called in. If we do not make some important changes in our hobby, we are at extreme risk.

I made <u>four</u> submissions, not two. On the resubmission, after a phone call to RCY, I did resubmit the <u>same</u> application to her on <u>her</u> instructions. Her concern at that time was with the cards and <u>not</u> the veracity of the contact. I followed her direction in returning to her the application.

If in <u>fact</u> the missed contact was in question, then the fourth submittal per your phone call to her, without <u>any LQT</u>, etc., contacts <u>should have been approved</u>. It was not.
