Net Operating Tips

The golden Rule of "do unto others...." is particularly applicable on our net. Remember that we are all trying to accomplish the same thing and that what we are doing is a COOPERATIVE .effort and not a COMPETITION. Why else would mobiles constatly go out of their way to give us a county we need? I know of one net member who made a round trip of over 600 miles to get the last county in the USA for someone. Everything we do or say on the net impacts all others listening, so lets try to be as considerate and fair in our operating procedures as possible. Cut-throat DX tactics, and long drawn-out phonetics to cover up others calling are never Fortunately, we proper. have relatively little of that among the REGULARS on our nets. I think most of you share my opinion that county hunters are the best froup of people in amateur radio.

The word "overP only takes a moment to say, and leaves no doubt that you have finished your transmission and are ready for the other station to respond. Some of us, because of voice inflection or long pauses between thoughts, may give the impression we are ready to receive when

actually we still have the mike button down; we obviously cannot hear anything while still in the transmit mode. However, the other party may THINK we are ready and start sending. If you frequently get doubled with, you might want to consider routinely saying "over" at the end of each transmission.

How is your duplex? Do you ever use your duplex? It is 0300z, do you know where your duplex is? The duplex switch on your radio changes the relationship of the two VFO's. RST signal report on CW, or Readability, Signal Strength, 15 Tone. the T still necessary? How many times have you heard ##2 or something other then ##9. Would a 598 cause your nose hairs to twinge. How many times have you heard, you are 599 with some distortion or click. If you would send 598c would the other party know what you mean. Perhaps it is time to send the Tone signal report to the archives to join the spark transmitter. There is more Tone differences on SSB then ever heard on CW. A valid county contact is 22 or more, so why add another character. Traditions die hard. Perhaps my esteemed colleague WOHKF will enlighten us. Just think how much less retraining it would be for a SSB'er to work the CW net.

The acute precision of logic and the clarity of presentation make it the first technical paper that I've ever been able to understand. I give it a 5-9 Plus.

VE3FNM Will - County Hunting has been a fustrating experience for me. From the record of the hams that have joined MARAC and dropped out, it appears that I am not alone. The best NC or Assistant NC is Margaret, WOGOQ, not because I first met her on the Century Club, nor because of her situaltion in Colorado, nor her voice but because she consistently gives at least the first three letters of every county. Some others do it spasmodically. There is no consideration to the ham who runs 100 watts or less and does not own a beam. I am in that catagory. In Canada we are permitted 1000 watts with a beam and in the U.S., 1500 watts with a beam. I complete against them. Some fun!! Some controllers consider that VE's are not DX, but we sure are. 1990 MARAC COUNTY HUNTERS CW CONTEST

0000Z Saturday 5 May, 1990 to 2400Z Sunday 6 May, 1990

The Mobile Amateur Radio Awards Club is pleased to sponsor the 22nd Annual County Hunters CW Contest. Mobile, portable and fixed operation from every county in the US is welcome and operation from less active counties is encouraged. Fixed stations may be worked only once on each band. Mobiles and portables may be worked each time they change counties. Mobiles operating on a county line give and receive one QSO number, but each county is a separate multiplier. Mobiles and portables must identify by signing /M or /P after their call. To be eligible for an award, a station must not operate more than one transmitter at any one time.

EXCHANGE: QSO Nr, Catagory (Mobile or Portable only), Sig Rpt, County and State for US; Province (Canada) or Country for others.

Sample Mobile report: 123M 599 MODOC CA

SCORING: QSOs with fixed US/Canadian stations are worth 1 point; mobiles and portables are worth 3 points. US / Canadian contacts with DX stations are worth 3 points. Contacts with stations operating under "Net Control" are invalid. FINAL SCORE = total QSO points times the total number of US counties worked.

FREQUENCIES: 3.575, 7.055, 14.060, 21.060, 28.060. Fixed stations should CQ or QRZ above the suggested frequencies and mobiles or portables operate below them.

AWARDS: <u>Certificates</u> to winning stations as follows:

- F First Place Fixed in each state, province and country with 1000 points or more.
- P First Place Portable in each state operating from a county other than their normal location with a score of 1000 points or more.
- \mbox{M} First Place Mobile in each state operating from 3 or more counties with a minimum of 10 QSOs from each county.

MARAC Plaques to the highest scoring: mobile and portable station in the U.S., North American fixed station and DX station scoring at least 50,000 total points.

Mobiles and portables who change states should calculate their scores (1) for individual state certificates and (2) for total score for the overall plaque. Total overall score must not count a county as a multiplier more than once regardless of the state from which it was worked.

Sample log and summary sheets are available for an SASE to the address below. A check list of counties is required for entries with 100 or more counties worked.

ATTENTION ALL RV'ERS

1. VALLEY FORGE TERRACE

No more than 10 minutes away from the Holiday Inn. We can guarantee places provided the unit does not exceed 32 feet total length. It is a permanent community with 27 additional sites on a first-come, first-served basis so it is imperative that we have your reservation for this park as early as possible. 
